## **SECTION B: TERMS OF REFERENCE**

### **1. Introduction to C-BRTA**

The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency (C-BRTA) is PFMA Schedule 3A Agency established through the Cross-Border Road Transport Act 4 of 1998 and provides advice, regulation, facilitation and law enforcement in respect of commercial cross border road transportation. The Act gives the C-BRTA mandate to licence commercial cross border road transport operators by issuing permits to operate. The provision of cross-border transport services in South Africa is subject to the provisions of the Cross-Border Road Transport Act. In terms of the Act, any person or organisation wishing to provide cross-border transport services must apply to the Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's Regulatory Committee for a Permit to conduct cross-border business.

The Cross-Border Road Transport Agency's (C-BRTA) thus exists, amongst others, to improve the flow of passengers and freight road transport in the region, introduce regulated competition in cross-border road transport, reduce operational constraints for the cross-border road transport industry, provide oversight and monitoring functions, and to improve the unimpeded transport flow by road of freight and passengers.

### **2. General rules and instructions**

- 2.1. Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, C-BRTA and its Client.
- 2.2. Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform C-BRTA within five (5) days after the publication of the RFQ.

**Bidders are invited to quote for Courier services between C-BRTA and Regional Offices.**

### 1. Background

Request for the procurement of courier services for the Cross-Border Road Transport Agency. There is a need to have a reliable and efficient courier service provider who is able to collect and deliver packages between Head Office and Regional Offices as speedily as possible.

In terms of the Standard Operating Procedure on Law Enforcement Processes, Regional Offices are required to send hard copies of documentation to Head Office on a weekly basis for recording, accounting and audit. Book management is controlled at Head Office, hence the ongoing need to send books to and from regional offices.

In addition to sending and receiving books and statistics, other business units also need to use the services of a courier company to send and receive documentation, logistics etc. to and from regional offices.

3. The services must include the collection and delivery of consignments in the form of documents, packages and equipment to and from C-BRTA offices listed above and will be expected to make deliveries at any additional address as the need arises.

#### **4. Courier Solution**

4.1. The service provider shall provide a courier service that includes the following:

- A timeous, consistent, reliable and secure collection and delivery processes.
- Appropriately secured vehicles for the safe collection and delivery of consignments.
- An effective packaging and labelling process. The service provider shall provide bags for the packaging of consignments.
- A secure storage site should delivery not take place on the same day as collected.
- Signing and authorization procedures.

#### **5. Tracking Solution**

5.1. The service provider must provide detailed information of its proposed tracking administration process comprising of at least the following:

- A tracking solution that will allow the C-BRTA to track status of collection and delivery of consignments.
- A central hub where records, dispatching and receiving of parcels occurs.
- Satellite tracking of vehicle.
- The solution must be accessible either via the web or mobile platform.

#### **6. Delivery Services**

6.1 All deliveries must be affected within the required time frames as stipulated below:

- All deliveries/collections shall be affected as per the request.
- All emergency deliveries/collections requests shall be done on the same day.
- The operating hours of C-BRTA are Monday to Friday, between 08h00 – 16h30. Where possible, deliveries shall always be made during office hours unless on emergency requests. The service provider shall have the capability to offer after hours/ Saturday/Sunday/Public Holiday services on special request.
- Same day services.

- Weekend services.
- After-hours services.
- Intra City services.
- Overnight express
- Overnight express
- Remote area/Regional services.
- Budget (Road Freight) services.

## 7. Insurance

- 7.1.1. The service provider shall be liable for any damage or loss of goods while in their possession.

**1. GENERAL CONDITIONS**

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

1.2 The applicable preference point system for this tender is the **80/20** preference point system.

1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) Specific Goals.

1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

1.5 Points for specific goals for this tender will be allocated on the basis B-BBEE Status Level as shown in Table 1 below.

1.6 In order to claim points for specific goals, bidders must submit B-BBBEE Certificate and/or sworn affidavit, as the case may be.

1.7 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

- 1.8 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

## 2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) **“the Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

### 3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

#### 3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

  - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
  - (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary.
